#### **Apply for a Trinity Scholarship!**



# Donations Needed for the Foster Youth Graduation Event

It is time to get ready for the annual Riverside County foster care graduation event! It will be held on Thursday, June 22, at La Sierra University. This event serves to propel the youth forward and engage them in services and resources leading toward success in adulthood. This event also provides them an opportunity to celebrate this major milestone

in their lives. The Riverside County Department of Public Social Services (DPSS) and local churches working together as Faith in Motion would like to congratulate them with a gift basket and gift cards. This event lets the young adults know their community is thinking about them and wants them to be successful in their transition into young adulthood.

DPSS is asking for our help to make this graduation party an important and fun event in their lives. They are requesting donations of gift baskets and gift cards. Trinity's Social Concerns Committee will create several baskets for these young adults. Each basket will have a theme and will have gift cards and other items in them. Here are examples of the gift basket themes:

- <u>College Study Success</u>: with school supplies, notebooks, pens, pencils, stapler, calculator, ruler, hole puncher, amazon.com or biblio.com gift cards for textbooks, backpack, printer paper, etc.
- <u>Dorm Move-In</u>: with extra-long twin sheets, comforter, pillowcase, hamper, desk lamp, shower supply caddy, plastic storage bins, towels, washcloths, laundry detergent, hangers, etc.
- <u>Activity Baskets</u>: such as Trip to the Beach with beach chair, beach towel, mats, reusable water bottle, sunblock, etc. or Movie Night with movie tickets and variety of snacks and/or gift cards, etc.
- <u>Variety Gift Card Basket</u>: they love themes such as a "Fast Food Frenzy" variety with Subway, Del Taco, McDonald's, Cold Stone, Panera, Starbucks, Jack in the Box, etc. – or a "Supermarket Sweep" with gift cards for Vons, Stater Brothers, Ralphs, Albertsons, etc.
- <u>Gift cards for Wal-Mart, Target, Game Stop, Best Buy, Forever 21, Amazon, movie theaters, fast food or mid-range dining restaurants are also appreciated.</u>

All donations are needed by Sunday, June 11. If you would like to help in this endeavor, you can purchase gift cards, provide items for the baskets, or provide a complete basket of items. ## **Sunday Coffee Hour**


Volunteers are needed to help with the coffee hour. If you would like to host and serve a simple treat on a Sunday, please sign up or call the church office.

One of the Bible readings on a recent Sunday was the story of the two disciples who met the risen Christ while they were walking from Jerusalem to the village of Emmaus (see Luke 24:13-35). It took place on the afternoon of the first Easter, when the disciples still didn't understand that Jesus had been raised from the dead.

As they were walking and discussing what had happened on Good Friday, and the amazing story that Mary Magdalene had told about finding Jesus' tomb empty earlier that day, Jesus came and began to walk with them. They didn't recognize him at first — maybe because they still thought he was dead! But as they walked and this stranger began to expound on the meaning of Scripture and the prophecies regarding the Messiah, they felt their hearts begin to burn within them. Later, when they sat down for dinner and Jesus blessed and broke the bread, their eyes were finally opened to recognize him. Then they hurried back to Jerusalem to tell the other disciples what they had seen and heard, and how they had met Christ along the way.

This week I am preparing to attend our annual synod assembly, which will be held at Hope Lutheran Church in Palm Desert on May 5-6. Carl and Shawn Lowell, Larry Dodson and Brenda S. Lussier will also be attending. The word "synod" comes from two Greek words that mean "together" and "way." It refers to people who are walking the way of Christ together. The synod assembly brings together Lutherans from many different congregations to make important decisions about our work together.

When I think of those two disciples walking to Emmaus, they were also walking together along the way. They were a synod of two. They began their journey feeling sad and discouraged, but after spending time walking together with Christ, they had a renewed energy, joy and hope. I have attended many synod assemblies over the years, and the highlights I remember of those gatherings are the times when it felt like we were walking together with Christ. That often happens during the inspirational times of worship that are part of a synod assembly, but sometimes it happens when the gathering tackles difficult issues or makes important decisions. At those times, I have felt my heart burning within me and my spirit renewed, a bit like those two disciples who were walking to Emmaus.

We can certainly encounter Christ in many other places and circumstances, but I'm glad to be able to spend time each year at the synod assembly walking together with my brothers and sisters in faith. Please pray that Christ guides us along our journey, and that his Spirit renews us and fills us with hope and joy.

#### **Pastor Report Highlights**

- The photo directory is progressing and quite a few photos have been taken.
- \$377 was raised for Shower of Hope from the Easter breakfast. Thank you to the hard-working crew who made breakfast. It was a wonderful fellowship gathering!
- Lenten offerings received on Ash Wednesday, at soup suppers, and on Good Friday totaled \$781 for World Hunger. The Lenten Food Drive received 82 bags of groceries.
- The next monthly reunion for Cursillo participants will be held at Trinity on Sunday, May 7, starting at 2:30 pm.
- Trinity is part of the rotation of churches that take turns hosting a monthly service Taizé in Riverside.
   The next service will be held at Trinity on Monday, May 8, at 7:00 pm.

#### **Treasurers Report**

 We completed March with \$20,550.24 in envelope giving and \$6,268.63 in unrestricted income.  The month of March finished with a negative net of \$5,795.51 due to maintenance and gas costs; however, the first quarter as a whole ended with a net income of \$35,317.14.

#### **Old Business**

- No Trespass signs were approved, and 8 new signs are being made. Installation soon.
- Concrete repairs are progressing, and two estimates were received. Voted to move ahead with the scheduling of the repairs.
- \$377 was raised for Shower of Hope from the Easter Narthex door closers were installed and we are now breakfast. Thank you to the hard-working crew who working on options for door stops.
  - Security Camera installation is complete and all 8 new cameras are working.
  - Search continues for a Choir Accompanist.
  - Discussions on additional handicapped parking options for services, especially for 11 am.

#### **New Business**

- 24 new folding chairs are being ordered for Heinecken Hall.
- Discussions on options for a summer worship schedule. No decision yet as we are still looking at options.

The next council meeting will be held on May 16, 2023, at 6:30 pm via Zoom.

#### Zoë Minter Receives Prestigious P.E.O. STAR Scholarship

Zoë Minter, a senior at Ramona High School, was selected to receive a \$2,500 STAR Scholarship from the P.E.O. Sisterhood. She was recommended by P.E.O. Chapter OH, many of whose members attend Trinity Lutheran Church. Chapter OH has been a part of the Riverside, California community since it was organized in 1953.

The P.E.O. STAR Scholarship was established in 2009 to provide scholarships for exceptional women in their final year of high school to attend an accredited postsecondary educational institution in the U.S. or Canada in the next academic year. The competitive STAR Scholarship is for women who exhibit excellence in leadership, academics, extracurricular activities, community service and potential for future success.

Ms. Minter is on the water polo team, the student council, various school clubs, and writes for and produces the student daily television broadcast, while maintaining more than a 4. GPA in her advanced placement courses. We know Zoë at Trinity as the Sunday school teacher. She will attend Riverside City College in the fall to prepare for her pursuit of a Bachelor of Science degree. Her ultimate goal is to become a physician to serve the local community.
