Pastor's Paragraphs

Christians remember the arrival of the wise men on the day of Epiphany, January 6. The word "epiphany" means the revealing or manifestation of something previously hidden. On the Sundays after Epiphany our Gospel readings focus on the ways Jesus was revealed as God's Son — from his baptism, his ministry of teaching, preaching, and healing, through the day of his transfiguration, when his face shone like the sun.

Again and again, Jesus revealed God's light and love. As followers of Christ, God's light is meant to shine from us as well. Like the old song says, "This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine!"

In December, I witnessed many wonderful ways we have let it shine. On December 9 and 10, our choir presented two joyful "Christmas Sing" concerts that brought many new faces to our church. In December we also donated 111 toys to distribute to families in Riverside through Lutheran Social Services and Family Promise. On December 13, I made a day trip to Tijuana in order to attend a graduation ceremony for Sister Liliana Camacho Angulo, whose education we helped pay for so that she could earn a degree in social work. (I talked about that trip in my sermon on December 17.)

At her graduation ceremony, Sister Lili presented me with a plaque to thank us for our support of her ministry as the founder of a children's home we have helped support since 2016 (on page 5 you can read what the plaque says). I was deeply touched by her words and the significance of crossing borders — of geography, language and culture — in order to share the light and love of Christ with children of all ages.

That same light has drawn others to our church who, like the wise men, have travelled far. In this newsletter you can read how a family from Ukraine has come to our church, thanks to the kindness of Larry Dodson and other members of Trinity.

In these and other ways, we are letting the light of Christ shine today!

A Heartwarming Journey of Kindness and Community

Remember the story I shared on November 26th about Larry Dodson's encounter at the Feeding America food bank? Today, I want to revisit this tale and offer an update on the family involved.

While picking up food at Feeding America on a Tuesday, Larry overheard a conversation between a representative and a young man seeking food for his family. They had immigrated from Ukraine to the US via Germany, losing nearly everything to the war. Larry, driven by empathy, invited the family to follow him back to Trinity Church. He knew the pantry volunteers could assemble a food basket.

Ihor, Hanna, and their three children, Adrian, Darii, and Anrianna, accepted Larry's invitation. At Trinity, they received not just a food basket but also gas money and other essentials. Their story, which I shared on that Sunday, resonated deeply with our church community.

After the service, the family met warm welcomes and embraces from many congregation members. They even received an offer of temporary accommodation from the Husted family. The kindness continued: the Husteds' daughter helped enroll the children in school, and other members generously donated food, clothing, and other necessities.

Since their first visit to our church, Ihor, Hanna, and their children have become a part of the Trinity community. They attend services, participate in activities, and feel an increasing sense of belonging. This journey, born from chance and fueled by empathy, exemplifies the true spirit of our church – a spirit of unwavering support and unconditional love.

This tale is more than just a heartwarming anecdote. It's a powerful reminder of the immense impact we can make on others through simple acts of kindness. It's a testament to the strength of community in times of need and the power of human connection.

Let's continue to embrace, offer support, and build bridges of compassion. Together, we can create a community where everyone feels welcome and loved.

Council Meeting Summary

The Trinity Council met via Zoom Tuesday 12/19/2023. Members present: Pastor Kent, Mary Kantola, Stacy Wheeler, Gary Goldberg, Wes Krashin, Theresa Husted, Karyl Robinson, and Larry Dodson. Pastor Kent led a devotional from the Advent Devotional from Matthew 1 and offered an opening prayer.

Pastor Report Highlights:

- Pastor Kent attended the graduation ceremony for Sister Lili of Casa Hogar Sonrisa de Angeles.
- Trinity has been approved to receive a \$1,000 grant
 from the Pacifica Synod's Matthew 25 Fund to purchase steel tables and shelving units for the Hope Pantry
- Pastor will be away on Sunday, January 20 the celebrate his brother's 70th birthday party.
- Two Christmas concerts were held December 9 and 10 went very well, attracting about 167 guests. This was a successful outreach to the community, and some new visitors who attended the concerts have come back to attend a worship service.
- The Holy Closure of Grace Lutheran Church will be on January 6, 2024, at 2pm, followed later by a dinner at the nearby VFW.

Treasurers Report:

- November was completed with \$41,206.26 in envelope giving and \$4,569.52 in unrestricted income. For the eleven months of the fiscal year, we have \$249,024.00 in envelope giving. Regular offerings for the eleven months of the fiscal year are \$277,024.90.
- We finished January through November with a net income of \$83,709.71. Please note that this large net is due to the \$30,000.00 from Grace Lutheran and the \$19,000.00 donated in November for replacing the air conditioners for the office and Heinecken Hall kitchen.

Old Business

- Christmas concert costs were paid with the donations received at the concerts and funds from Trinity Arts Program. Thoughts are to set a more formal budget going forward.
- Property updates: Discussion of potential space needs for LSS. Carpets need to be cleaned in LSS small office. Sanctuary carpets were cleaned. Heat pump installations have begun, with completion anticipated after Christmas.
- Update on Audit Committee recommendations: additional volunteers are needed for counting the weekly offerings.

New Business:

- Two meeting requests were approved: A beginners Al-Anon group to meet Fridays at 7-8 pm in Heinecken Hall. PEO group may meet monthly on the first Thursday in Poat Parlor at 10 am.
- Approval to increase missionary support to \$25 per week for our missionaries serving in Japan.
- Approval of Endowment Grant Recommendations of \$1,000 each to the ELCA Chaplaincy Fund for Leaders, Family Promise, Trinity Arts Program, and Agape Campus Ministry in San Diego.
- Approval of Endowment fund grants in 2024 in the amount of \$1,000 each for Trinity's day camp and for our missionary in China.
- Nominating Committee is seeking nominees for elected positions. The council reviewed a list of elected positions needed for 2024.
- Update on office staff needs going forward.
- Approval of using Trinity as the Ministry in Context for Brenda S. Lussier for Spring Semester 2024
- Brenda S. Lussier, financial secretary, joined the meeting for discussions regarding the 2024 budget.

The next council meeting will be held on January 16, 2024, at 6:30 pm.

Celebrating Birthdays at Trinity

At the beginning of our 9:30 am Sunday worship service, we invite anyone with a birthday that week to come up and let us sing "Happy Birthday" for them. We also have a small coin box that those celebrating their birthdays drop coins into (quarters, dimes, nickels or pennies — one cent for every year of their age). The money we collect is now used to provide birthday cakes for children in Riverside's Family Promise program.

This tradition began many years ago, when it was part of the Sunday School opening ceremony at Trinity. When the contemporary service was begun in 1993, Sunday School students began to attend the beginning of that worship service and then were dismissed to their classes. The birthday recognition was added to the opening announcements for that service, and continues to be part of our gathering ritual today.
