Foster Care Graduation Report

This year, the Annual Foster Youth Graduation Event took place on June 20, 2024, at Harvest Church in Riverside. The purpose of this annual event is to propel foster youth forward, engaging them in services and resources that pave the way for success in adulthood, whether they are heading to college or starting employment. Most importantly, it serves to celebrate this significant milestone in their lives.

Faith in Motion, working with 12 local churches including Trinity, participated in celebrating the achievements of the foster youth who graduated from high school. Graduates received candied leis and gift baskets filled with gift cards and other goodies provided by various faith partners.

At Trinity, we generously supported this program by providing 17 gift baskets with a total value of \$2,300, 32 gift cards totaling \$800, plus candy, bows, and cellophane for decorating additional gift baskets, totaling \$135. Altogether, Trinity's contributions amounted to \$3,235. Because of your generosity, we have been able to make a meaningful impact on the lives of these young graduates, helping to set them on a path toward a brighter future. Pastor's Paragraphs

It's summertime, and with the change of seasons come some important changes at our church. On July 1, Brenda S. Lussier began a six-month internship as part of her preparation to become a diaconal minister. She will split her internship time between Trinity and Eden Lutheran Church. You can read more about this on page 5.

Brenda led worship and preached at Trinity on June 30. As part of our Pride observance, she preached a powerful message about the challenges faced by people who experience rejection or derision because of their sexual orientation or gender identity. Speaking from her own experience as the mother of a transgender daughter, Brenda closed her message with a poem she had written to express her feelings. You can read her poem in this newsletter, and if you missed worship on June 30, you can watch a recording of the service on our YouTube channel.

On Sunday, July 7, we will note another transition, as Michael Myers retires from his position as our church's Administrative Assistant. He isn't leaving our church, and he will continue to serve in volunteer roles of his choosing, but you won't find him working in the office during the week. I have relied on Michael to handle many of the day-to-day functions of our church, and am deeply grateful for his years of faithful service in our church office. Please join me in giving thanks and expressing our gratitude for Michael's service to God and to our church.

I am also grateful that one of our newest members, Kathy Newlen, will be taking over Michael's responsibilities as our new Administrative Assistant. She has been working side-by-side with Michael for several weeks, along with tutoring from Brenda Lussier. Please be patient and be sure to introduce yourself to her as Kathy gets to know us all and becomes familiar with her new tasks.

Another change in the past month has been the decision by Lutheran Social Services to close their office at Trinity and consolidate their operations at their new location on Indiana Avenue. They are working on expanding their programs in Riverside, and needed more space than our church could provide. One new program involves the purchase of a van that will be used as a mobile unit to go where needed to provide services. For example, the LSS van will be at Trinity on Wednesday mornings when our food pantry is open and on Thursdays when the Shower of Hope program is operating.

Amid these and other changes in our church and the world around us. I'm grateful that the Gospel's message of love and mercy never changes, for "Jesus Christ is the same vesterday and today and forever" (Heb. 13:8). Pastor Kent

My Diaconal Journey: An Update from Brenda S. Lussier

As you know, I have been a seminary student at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary for the past two years. In May, I completed all of my classes — YAY! — and now I am heading into my internship, which is mandatory for all candidates for ELCA ordination into the Ministry of Word and Service.

While I have finished my classes, the internship is also considered a class, and I still have a project to complete and, yes, another paper to write. The purpose of the internship is to help me develop my skills and support my training for future roles in ministry and pastoral work.

I will be serving my internship, which requires 1,000 hours under the supervision of two experienced Pastors, Pastor Stephanie Lape at Eden and Pastor Kent Tuohino here at Trinity, starting July 1 and ending December 31. The internship is split into two parts: worship and community. At Trinity, my internship will focus on community work. I will continue my efforts with Banquets at Trinity, Shower of Hope, assist with the Hope Pantry if needed, and take on other assignments as they arise. For the worship portion, I will serve at Eden on Sundays, learning more about worship by preaching and participating in various areas of the church. This means that for the most part, I will be worshiping with the Eden community for the next six months, so you will not see me on many Sundays. I am looking forward to getting to know the congregation of Eden and am excited about my journey over the next six months.

I am filled with hope and faith as I move into this new chapter of my journey. I trust that God is guiding me every step of the way, and I am excited about the opportunities to grow and serve in new ways. Thank you for your support as I have traveled this journey, and I ask for your continued support and prayers during this important time.

Trinity's Council met via Zoom on Tuesday, June 18. The meeting was called to order at 6:32 pm by Gary Goldberg. Members present: Larry Dodson, Peggy Fryc, Gary Goldberg, Cherie Guillow, Wes Krashin, Brenda S. Lussier, Mike McMichael, Karyl Robinson, Sue Rogers, and Pastor Kent.

Pastor's Report: Luke Hamilton, Sandy Rodriguez and Pastor Kent represented Trinity at the Pacifica Synod's online "Azoombly" on Saturday, June 15. Larry Dodson and Brenda S. Lussier also attended as members of the synod council. Pastor baptized 6month-old twins Wyatt and Charlotte Venegas at the 11 am service on Sunday, June 16.

Treasurer's Report: Brenda has made changes to the format of the Treasurer's Report to make it easier to find financial data. Income projections for May were met and all bills were paid. We've hired a new teacher for Sunday School, named Fernanda Ruelas.

Old Business

- <u>Property</u>: Mike is installing new flooring in the small office in the Cooper-Burhart Annex. He hopes to have it done by the end of the month. He is having problems with the roofing company about the sanctuary roofing and gutter work. Gary Goldberg will send an official letter to them. A mold problem in the cooling system for the sanctuary will be treated by Taylor Corbin of Chem Search.
- <u>Church Directory</u>: Pictures of new members and others will be taken by Bill Nicoletti on Sunday, June 23rd.
- <u>Missionary Visit</u>: Pastor moved that we help with the expenses for the missionary scheduled to visit Trinity on Wednesday, September 11, with a minimum gift of \$320.00. Seconded by Karyl Robinson. Motion carried.
- <u>Century Club</u>: We will plan to have a luncheon sometime in September. We presently have \$5,918.85 in this account. We still have items approved that have not yet been finished. Pastor Kent

will report on these items at our next meeting. This year's Sunday of Service will be on September 8.

New Business

- <u>LSS Office Closing at Trinity</u>: Lutheran Social Services has decided not to renew their lease at Trinity and will consolidate their operations at their new location on Indiana Avenue. They will vacate the office at Trinity by June 30th. The future use of this room will be on the agenda for the next Council meeting. The storage shed will revert back to the church. We will also lose Internet service to Cooper -Burkhart House, so this needs to be addressed.
- <u>Church Office Transition</u>: Michael Myers and Brenda Lussier have been training our new Administrative Assistant, Kathy Newlen. Starting in July, the new office hours will be 9 am to 1 pm, Monday-Friday. Michael Myer's retirement day will be Sunday, July 7th. Karen Myers is planning the coffee hour that Sunday. Come and thank Michael for his faithful service to our church!
- <u>Update List of Account Signers</u>: We will add our new Administrative Assistant, Kathy Newlen, to our current list of authorized signers for the church's Altura Credit Union account.
- Internship Plans for Brenda: Her 6-month diaconal internship will be from July through December. Starting July 1st, she will work 20 hours/week at Eden and 20 hours/week at Trinity. She will attend Eden's Sunday services and perform necessary duties at Trinity for BAT and Shower of Hope during the week.
- <u>Pastor Kent</u> will be on vacation the last week of June, and Brenda will preach and lead worship on Sunday, June 30. We will celebrate Pride Sunday that day.

The next Council meeting will be on Tuesday, July 16, at 6:30 pm. The meeting will be held in person, in Cooper-Burkhart House.
