Thank You, Team Trinity, for Participating in CROP Walk 2025!

Eleven energetic Trinity members (plus two members from Eden Lutheran and a member of First Lutheran in Redlands) participated in the annual Riverside CROP Walk on Sunday afternoon, March 23rd. We met at First United Methodist Church along with participants from other local congregations.

After registering, then listening to a very short program (including a poem by one of our Trinity ladies), we all began walking.

Halfway through the CROP Walk, our group arrived at Trinity to enjoy cold drinks and tasty snacks served by Kelly Krashin and Sue Rogers under a pop-up canopy. Following our short break in the shade, we returned to First United Methodist to finish the two-mile walk. 106 people from 10 churches participated in this year's walk, and raised a total of \$24,591.23 as of March 27. "Team Trinity" raised \$3,161.40. While most of these donations will help feed the hungry in other parts of the world, a small portion will go to the BAT meal program at Trinity, along with other Riverside church programs that feed the hungry.

Thank you to all our Trinity participants who completed the event despite the 80-degree afternoon heat. Thanks also to Helga Stafford, our hardworking CROP Walk coordinator. And kudos to Pastor Kent for not only joining us on the CROP Walk as he always does, but for helping locate a participant's lost cellphone, too. Go, Team Trinity!

We're inspired by the words of Jesus in Matthew 25:35, "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink. I was a stranger and you invited me in."

Pastor's Paragraphs

During this Lenten season, our Wednesday soup suppers have featured a study of Jesus' disciple Peter. Peter is a fascinating figure because he is so relatable. He is far from perfect, he says things he later regrets, and he doesn't always understand what Jesus is saying.

For example, when Jesus asked his disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" Peter confidently said, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." (Matthew 16:16). Jesus commended him for that answer. But a few minutes later — when Jesus began to tell his disciples that he would be arrested, tortured and killed — Peter objected, saying, "This must never happen to you!" And Jesus replied, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are setting your mind not on what God wants, but what you want." How those words must have stung Peter's ears — one moment he was the top student in the class, and the next moment he was the devil, because he was tempting Jesus to disobey God's will.

Later, at the Last Supper, Peter made a brash promise. He said that, even if others fall away, he never would. And when Jesus said that Peter would deny him three times, Peter said he would never do that. "Even if I were to die with you, I would never deny you." But a few hours later, after Jesus had been arrested, Peter did exactly what Jesus had foretold. Then, when a rooster crowed and Peter realized what he had done, he wept bitterly.

You might think that Jesus would have chosen someone else to become a leader of the disciples and, after Pentecost, the leader of the early church. But Jesus knew what he was doing. He could see the potential in Peter, even when Peter could not. He knew that Peter would learn humility through his own repentance; he would learn compassion for others from his own failings. The Apostle Paul had a similar experience, and the message he got from the Lord was "my grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." (1 Corinthians 12:9)

It's comforting to know that someone with so many faults as Peter had could still be one of Jesus's closest friends and allies. Jesus used Peter (and others) to change the world. If Christ can use Peter in spite of his "wandering heart," then maybe the Lord and use me, too. As things are right now, the world could certainly use some changes!

Council Meeting Summary

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 6:03pm on Tuesday, March 18, by Karyl Robinson. Members present: Theresa Husted, Karyl Robinson, Cherie Guillow, Brenda S. Lussier, Pastor Kent, Kelly Krashin, Larry Dodson, Shawn Lowell, Gil Heth, Peggy Fryc, Steve Newlen. Absent: Sue Rogers.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Stephanie Lape at Eden is leaving after March 30th; she has accepted a call to another congregation. Brenda S. Lussier and Pastor Kent will alternate leading the service and Bible study at the remaining Wednesday Lenten soup dinners at Eden and Trinity. Six new members will join our church on March 23rd. On March 23rd Marge Clark's two grandchildren will be baptized. Also, on March 23rd Bethlehem handcrafts will be available for sale between services. On March 28th both Brenda S. Lussier and Pastor Kent will be out of town for the Tapestry retreat. Glenn Pickett will preach the sermon and John Collins will lead worship. Ihor Rohozhyskyi has repaired the ceiling in the narthex. Brenda S. Lussier will attend her seminary graduation ceremony in Berkeley on Saturday, May 24.

Treasurer's Report: All bills are paid and all expense accounts are under budget.

Old Business Items:

- <u>Church Website</u> Theresa Husted's son-in-law, John Dadlez, is willing to help update this. Brenda S. Lussier will form a committee to meet with him.
- <u>Deacon Call Committee</u> it will meet on Sunday, March 23rd, after the 11 am service.
- Property Maintenance We have received a settlement check from the roofing company. This money will go into the property account. We can now investigate repairing the gutters over the sanctuary now that the roof repair issue is resolved. The roof and ceiling in the narthex have been repaired by Ihor Rohozhyskyi. Several parking lot lights are not working. The sanctuary lighting project is moving forward.
- Strategic Growth Team Barb Beaver is working with Glenn Pickett on forming this team.

New Business:

Recording of the "Dietrich & Maria" Musical –
 Glenn Pickett asked the council to approve us-

ing our church to receive the donations needed to pay for this recording project. It will cost an estimated \$41,650 to produce the album. Only after we have received sufficient donations would we pay the expenses (so there would be no financial risk to Trinity). Brenda S. Lussier will investigate the tax laws regarding this. [Update: The council had a special meeting on April 1 to approve this proposal after determining that this fundraiser will not cause any tax problems for the church.]

- <u>Easter Breakfast</u> Pastor Kent moved that the proceeds from the Easter breakfast go to Trinity's quilting bee. Approved.
- <u>CPR & AED Training</u> We presently have 6
 people interested in being trained. Brenda will
 work on scheduling a date for training.
- Parking Lot Rent The council approved suspending parking lot rent payments by Dr. Sharma for 6 months; from January 1, till June 30, 2025, with the matter to be revisited at the June council meeting.
- Parking Lot Repairs & Recoating We will start investigating the cost for this project.
- Window Blinds in Heinecken Hall, Narthex and Poat Parlor We need to investigate the cost for the Narthex and Poat Parlor. We have about \$6,000.00 in the Century Club account to cover the cost. The council members agreed that we do not need to replace the blinds that were removed in Heinecken Hall.
- Storage Shed Use The padlocks on four gates and the shed are now keyed alike. The shed has a separate key for the door handle. For now, the shed is being used to store items for the rummage sale. A decision about the future use of the shed has been tabled until June.
- Bathroom Accessibility There was a discussion about making the bathrooms wheelchair accessible. Shawn Lowell will investigate what we can do and what the cost would be.
- Council Retreat After discussing dates, the council will meet at Trinity for a planning retreat on Sunday, May 4, from 12:00 to 4:00 pm.

Adjournment and Closing Prayer: Pastor Kent closed the meeting with a prayer. The meeting was adjourned at 8:52 pm.
